

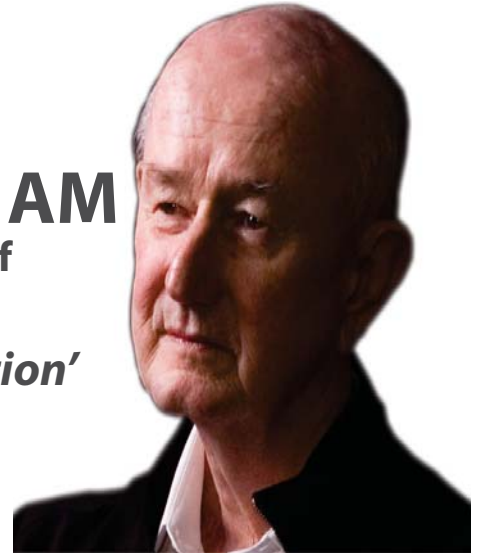

TONY BROE is the Senior Principal Research Fellow at Neuroscience Research Australia, Randwick and Conjoint Professor of Geriatric Medicine, Prince of Wales Hospital Randwick and the University of New South Wales.

Tony has a BA in Anthropology and trained in Internal Medicine, Geriatric Medicine and Neurology. He was Professor of Geriatric Medicine, University of Sydney from 1985 to 1999 and was awarded the AM in 1988. He has written over 150 papers and 20 book chapters on Ageing, Dementia and Parkinsonism.

Since 2000 he has developed an integrated Aboriginal Community Health Service with the La Perouse community and has conducted research in Aboriginal health and ageing with Aboriginal communities across NSW.
