Dr Mann ' s current work focuses on home monitoring and communications technologies (tele-health, telehomecare), and older driver assessment and rehabilitation. Dr. Mann has authored more than 125 articles and book chapters on ageing and independence in the past 15 years, authored four books, and served as founder and co-editor of the journal Technology and Disability from 1990 to 2000. He has served as the Conference Chair for the International Conference on Aging, Disability and Independence and also serves on the boards of the American Society on Aging and the Florida Council on ageing. His work extends internationally to projects in Brazil and he is an honorary professor at the University of Sydney. Dr. Mann has over 35 years of experience in rehabilitation and community-based programs. His work over the past 20 years has focused on approaches to promoting independence with technology, including driving and smart technology for persons with disabilities.
