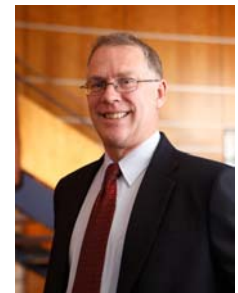
range of activities from biological, behavioural, clinical and policy and planning sectors.

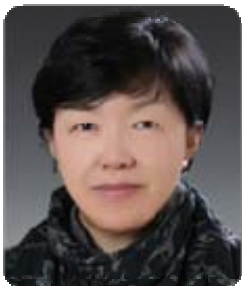

Global Dementia Legacy Event

The Global Dementia Legacy Event Japan was held at Roppongi Academy Hills from November 5th to 7th, 2014. The Ministry of Health, Labor & Welfare, National Center for Geriatrics and Gerontology, and Tokyo Dementia Care Research & Training Center organized this event. Over 300 delegates from more than ten nations including many members of the Japan Gerontological Society attended. As decided in the G8 Dementia Summit in London last year, Japan is expected to play a major role in innovative care and prevention, and productive discussion on "New Care and Prevention Models" was held.
