EMERITUS PROF TREVOR R. PARMENTER

Trevor R. Parmenter, AM BA PhD FACE FAAIDD FFIASSID FASSID, is professor Emeritus in the Sydney Medical School, University of Sydney, and Honorary Professor in the Faculties of Education and Social Work and Health Sciences at the University of Sydney; and Adjunct Professor in the School of Rural Medicine, University of New England. He formerly held Foundation Chair of Developmental Disability Studies in the Sydney Medical School and Director of the Centre Disability Studies at the Royal Rehabilitation Centre Sydney (1997 - 2009).



MR PAUL SADLER

Paul Sadler is currently the CEO of Presbyterian Aged Care NSW & ACT, Presbyterian Aged Care serves over 1,300 older people through residential aged care, community care and retirement housing across metropolitan and regional areas of NSW and ACT. Previously, Paul was CEO of the Aged & Community Services Association of NSW & ACT, the peak body representing not-for-profit aged and community care service providers. He also held various positions on ageing and disability issues in the NSW Government, including Manager of Home and Community Care (HACC) and Ageing Programs, and worked as a social worker with frail older people, people with disabilities and their carers.

Christine Regan is the Senior Policy Officer at the Council of Social Service of NSW(NCOSS) since 1998. Since June 2011, she has convened the NSW Disability Network Forum, a consultative and issues forum for non-government non-industry peak disability representative, advocacy and information organisations. THE NSW Disability Network Forum advocates for the rights, needs and interests of people with disability in NSW across a broad range of government and sector agencies.
