



The 2018 Arthur Everitt Award for AAG student research members. 2018 AAG Conference

Applications close 3rd of September 2018



THE AWARD:

The Arthur Everitt Award provides two opportunities for eligible AAG student members to receive financial assistance to present their research at the AAG Conference. The Award is designed to encourage and support exposure for research candidates by enhancing opportunities for professional participation and practice within the AAG network and community.

AAG will award the two AAG student members based on the highest quality abstracts as decided by the National Conference Scientific Committee.

THE PRIZE:

AAG will provide two scholarships of \$1,000 for two AAG student members who are not receiving other funding to attend the AAG Conference in Melbourne.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Applicants must be a current AAG 'Student' member.

Applicants must be attending "Full Conference" to the AAG conference in the year of application for the Award and presenting their research findings via an oral, poster or tabletop presentation.

Applicants do not have to have had their abstracts accepted at the time of submitting their application for the Award but must show proof of acceptance as soon as received.
