Australian Association of Gerontology (AAG)



In this AAG pre-conference workshop we will be exploring reablement approaches and how they can be applied using an evidence-based approach across aged care; from assessment services to home and residential settings.

In line with the recommendations of recent reviews, the Australian Government is supporting aged care providers to adopt service provision approaches that “promote greater independence, mobility and autonomy, reducing or delaying the need for more complex aged care support services”. This includes funding for a trial of a revised assessment model for older Australians accessing entry/level aged care services (Budget 2018-19. Better Ageing - promoting independent living).

AAG is currently working on a project to support service providers in adopting evidence-based approaches to reablement. This project comprises a series of activities exploring international evidence on reablement approaches, how they currently being applied in aged care in Australia, and how they can better be applied in the future.

This workshop build on learnings to date to work towards future best-practice models of aged care service provision with reablement approaches.

Participants with an interest in reablement and aged care are welcome to attend.

No prior knowledge is necessary: All participants will be provided with background information to read before the workshop and experts will be present at the workshop to facilitate the discussions.
