



UPDATE for ILC Australia: June 2019.

COLLABORATIVE PROJECTS and GRANT SUBMISSIONS

The Landings: Live well, age well.

We are building on our experience working with the landings project to develop a set of community-based co-designed well being programs, with two projects moving forward:

- 1) A Delphi process to identify and priorities wellbeing activities to be addressed through train-the-trainer approaches to health promotion (similar to Cooking for 1 or 2). A questionnaire is being designed based on our workshop at AAG last year, and ethics approval sought.
- 2) A collaborative project with Bolton Clarke and funded by Cromwell Property Group Foundation, to extend the wellbeing program to another retirement community.

International Project Long Term Care

The aim of this research is to develop an international framework for describing and classifying Long Term Care (LTC) systems in different countries according to their ability to meet the needs of older people. A grant proposal has been submitted to the Australian Research Council. Meanwhile, we are developing a Delphi survey to finalise the draft framework.

International Exchange on the Positive Aspects of Caring for Older Adults (PACOA)

ILC GA members, are preparing a grant application for a project to identify patterns of positive caregiving experiences as they are shaped by personal, social, political and economic factors. ILC Canada has been funded to host a two-day face-to-face meeting as well as teleconference meetings that bring together a global multidisciplinary team of investigators and clinicians in collaboration through the International Longevity Centres-Global Alliance. **Briony Dow** is the ILC Aus representative on this project.

Frailty:

ILC AUS members Bolton Clarke and RCGHA have been collaborating on projects to improve outcomes for frail older people.

AAG Reablement Project 2017-19

AAG is currently conducting a series of activities exploring the reablement, how it is currently being applied in aged care in Australia and how it can better be applied in the future.

The Hal Kendig Research Development Program's purpose is to support early career researchers to improve their track record to lead to an ARC Grant or Fellowship or comparable research funding, and to support a discrete research effort that provides evidence and critical thinking that furthers the interests of vulnerable older people in advanced age.

Two \$20,000 grants for projects of 18 month duration will be made available – applications open on 3rd June and closes on 29 July 2019.

Professor Tony Broe AM



Topic: **Population Ageing & Indigenous Australians:**
Political, Social & Biological Determinants of healthy ageing

Professor Tony Broe graduated in social science (Anthropology, Geography) and Medicine from the University of Sydney. He trained in General Medicine, Geriatric Medicine and Neurology in Sydney, Glasgow and the Mayo Clinic (1966 to 1973). He was head of the University Clinical School and the Department of Neurosciences at Lidcombe Hospital (1975 to 1985); Prof of Geriatric Medicine at Concord Hospital and University of Sydney (1985 to 1999) and University of NSW (1999-2016).

He has published some 200 papers, 20 Book Chapters and 4 Books on neuroepidemiology, neurodegenerative disorders and Aboriginal health & ageing. He has set up Health Services in Neurosciences, Aged Care, Community Health & Aboriginal Health.

Tony was the AAG President (2003 – 2006)
Tony is currently Senior Principal Research Fellow (SPRF) at
Neuroscience Research Australia (NEURA).

Dr Butler, was a physician, psychiatrist and gerontologist, who pioneered studies in ageing.

He was the first Director of the USA National Institute on Ageing,
and is a Pulitzer Prize-winning author.

He was a strong advocate for older people and for enabling people to get the most out of their older years.
