5. Are the priority areas for investment identified in the Implementation Plan the most effective way for delivering on the Mission's goal and aims? (Max 300 words)

AAG welcomes the focus on a life-course, preventative approach to ageing under Aim 2 and the holistic biopsychosocial approach promoted in Aim 3.

AAG welcomes the shift away from the first Mission Goals related to dementia released for consultation in February 2020 which had a focus on diagnosis to promoting wellbeing and quality of life for those living with dementia.

AAG supports the specific aims that address dementia (aim 1) versus ageing more broadly (aims 2-4). AAG suggests that it should be explicitly stated that aims 2-4 exclude dementia-related research.

Otherwise there is a risk that dementia-related research will be disproportionately funded over other ageing-related research, as has been the case in the past. This is a problem given that:

1. Dementia and ageing are not inextricably linked for all people,
2. There are many other common conditions and diseases that affect older people, and
3. This may lead to a preventative, life-course to healthy ageing in the broadest holistic biopsychosocial sense approach being underfunded.

AAG notes that there tends to only be a focus on preventative life-course approaches in relation to a specific disease or condition, rather than as a holistic model applicable to all older people. The MRFF has an opportunity to address this through funding novel research programs that improve the ageing experience without being disease/condition specific.

AAG supports the language shift from the Mission draft in February 2020 from “end user” or “patient” to “people” and “older people”.

The third Aim should be expanded to promote human rights in both the context of particular research investigations and also as a research topic in itself. Potential wording for an additional dot-point under 3.1 could be:

“identify how the human rights of older people can be protected.”

7. Are the 'Evaluation approach and measures' appropriate for assessing and monitoring progress towards the mission's goal and aims? (Max 200 words)

Overall, focus on "strategies" rather than "tools" as there are many tools available already. "Developing new tools where existing tools do not meet the evaluation needs" could be referenced.

Aim 1 dot-point 3 requires 'quality of life' definition. AAG's Feb 2020 response to the MRFF DAAC Mission notes 'quality of life' is a somewhat vague concept, and it could be helpful to state measures in a way which reflects concepts expressed in WHO definition of 'health' and 'healthy ageing'.

Aim 2 dot-point 2 requires a more specific definition of "healthy life expectancy" to be measurable. For example, are we talking about number of years with no chronic conditions, a reduced number of chronic conditions, or a reduction in activity of daily living the person needs assistance with? See also AAG's Feb 2020 response to the MRFF DAAC Mission which notes more appropriate biopsychosocial definitions of 'health'.

It is unclear if Aim 3 dot-point 1 refers to the adoption of a comprehensive and complete list of key components of high-quality care across the aged care spectrum, or just the adoption of those components identified through the funded research. The latter is a more realistic goal, especially considering dot-point 2.
