### **BONNIE FIELD**

PhD Candidate, University of Canberra

She has spent 10 years at the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare and 7 years at Food Standards Australia New Zealand interspersed with periods at the Commonwealth Department of Health and the University of Queensland. The focus of her work has been in food and nutrition. She has also worked in cardiovascular disease, diabetes and risk factor monitoring. Bonnie is in the first year of a PhD at the University of Canberra in the recently established Centre for Research and Action in Public Health.
