





### 7-YEAR LONGITUDINAL STUDY







### RECEIVING ASSISTANCE



- ECH residents are more likely to receive assistance with shopping, home maintenance, finances and health
- A lower proportion of ECH residents require assistance with household tasks and preparing meals
- Family is the most important source of support for both ECH residents and the community population


